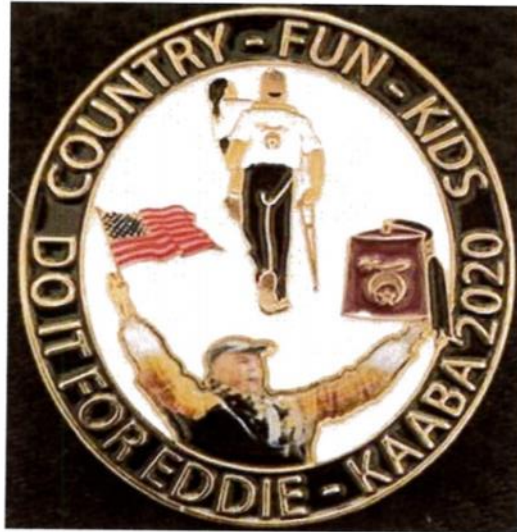

## **Missing Man (Fallen Comrade) Table**

**With Memorial Day weekend around the corner, there are people who do not know the purpose or meaning of a small round table (usually) set by itself for one person with an empty chair, a white tablecloth, a single rose (usually red) in a vase with a red ribbon, a bread plate with a slice of lemon and salt sprinkled on the plate, an inverted glass, a Bible, and a lit candle. The table is either called the Missing Man Table, the Fallen Comrade Table, or the Remembrance Table to show tribute to those who have sacrificed their lives, those who are still considered as missing in action, and those who have served to help keep this nation free and safe. The table serves as the focal point of ceremonial remembrance, originally growing out of US concern of the Vietnam War POW/MIA issue. The following is the explanation of the meaning of each item on the table.**

- **A small table set for one, symbolizing the isolation of the absent service member. The table is round to represent the everlasting concern the survivors have for the missing.**
- **A white tablecloth to symbolize the pure intentions of the service members who responded to the country's call to arms.**
- **One or more head covers may be placed upon the table represent the armed service of the missing persons.**
- **A single rose in the vase symbolizing the blood that service members have shed in sacrifice to ensure the freedom of the United States of America. This rose also represents the family and friends who keep the faith while awaiting the return of the missing service members.**
- **The red ribbon represents a love of country that inspired the service members to serve the country.**
- **A slice of lemon on the bread plate that represents the bitter fate of the missing.**
- **Salt sprinkled on the bread plate that symbolizes the tears shed by waiting families.**
- **An inverted glass to represent fact that the missing and fallen cannot partake.**
- **A Bible represents the spiritual strength and faith to sustain the lost. This may be omitted in official displays.**
- **A lit candle symbolizes a light of hope that lives in hearts to illuminate the missing's way home.**

**An empty chair to represent the absence of the missing and fallen.**

## Know a Veteran, Tell a Veteran

If you are veteran or know of a veteran, have some good news. Beginning January 1, 2020 eligible veterans who have a Veteran's Health Identification Card (VHIC) from the Department of Veterans Affairs can now gain access to military commissary, exchange, and Morale, Welfare and Recreation (MWR) retail privileges on U.S. military installations as specified in the Purple Heart and Disabled Veterans Equal Access Act of 2018 and included in the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019.

Access includes veterans who have service-connected disabilities, veterans who are Purple Heart recipients, veterans who are former prisoners of war, and individuals approved and designated as a primary family caregiver of eligible veterans under the Department of Veterans Affairs Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers.

Veterans and caregivers will also have access to the following:

- 1) Official lodging facilities on space-available basis (this does not apply to DoD privatized lodging facilities).
- 2) MWR bowling activities
- 3) MWR camping activities, Outdoor Recreation Equipment Check-out and marinas.

MWR programs NOT authorized for use are Child Youth Services and Fitness Center. There will be more additional MWR activities come available in the future.

Eligible veterans can stop at the installation's visitor center to be issued a Visitor's Pass or register their VHIC to gain access to the installation. Veterans must show a valid Veterans Affairs (VA) issued VHIC that will be registered for installation access. The VHIC must display the veteran's eligibility status such as Purple Heart, Former POW, or Service Connected. Veterans with 0% rating and caregivers will show VA HEC Form H623A along with acceptable credentials.

The man I sat next to then reached into his wallet and pulled out a piece of paper that was wrinkled and folded, but was hand-written; it was a farmer's prayer and now I'm sending to you by regular mail.

I know this is not shrine related, but I was wondering if we could submit this to the Kaabagram, since I think a lot of our members could relate. This is a copy of the letter since the original was hard to read .

In the old farm house we heated it with wood. My folks always did the best that they could. We never had a 40 hr. week or overtime. Our life was all overtime with the old lantern to give us light out to the barn or outhouse late at night. Our old cook stove gave us hot water for our weekly bath. Sometimes it wasn't that hot, yet we took our bath whether we needed it or not. We took turns for meals at the table. We took our place. We didn't grab a dish. We waited for the table grace. We were thankful for all the food we had to eat. Eggs - milk and cream that we had to churn. It was struggle yet we took our turn. Lord let me not forget all our farmers slopping hogs - milking cows. Working hard for all the food we had to eat. A farmer's work is never done. It's 7 days a week with no time for fishing in the creek. Now Lord you have my attention now. Help me with this portion that I now take. Not to eat too much for heaven's sake.

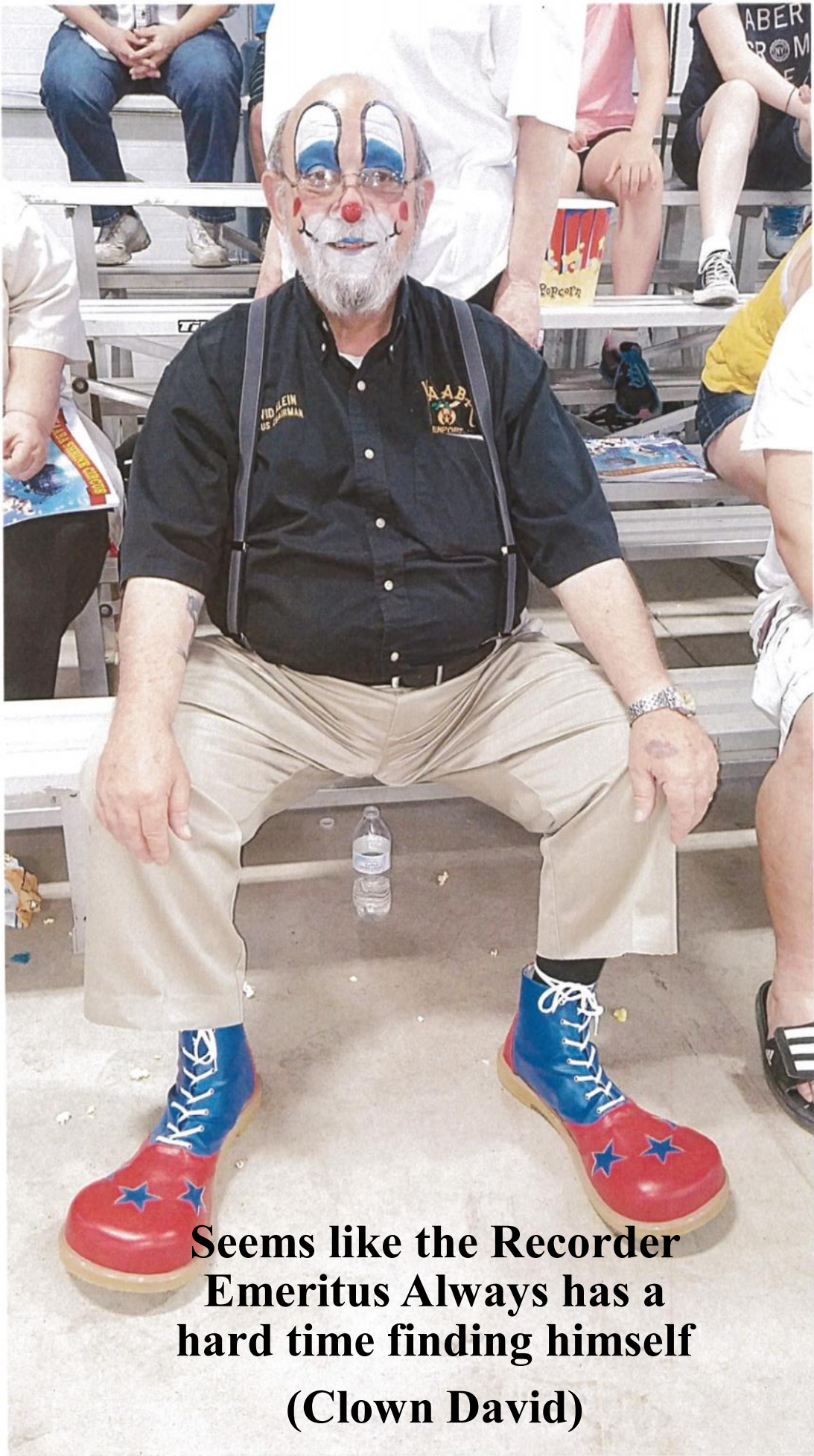

# Masonic Burial by the Enemy

On June 11, 1863, the Federal gunboat Albatross, with Lieut. J.E. Hart of St. George's Lodge #6 in New York in command, was anchored on the Mississippi River opposite the town of St. Francisville, about 15 miles above the Rebel fortification of Port Hudson. The gunboat was part of the ships laying siege to Port Hudson, Louisiana. Commander Hart had been in a delirium for many days and was confined to his quarters. A shot rang from his quarters and the Ship's executive officer Theodore E. Dubois and the ship's doctor found the commander dead.

The officer's of the ship not wanting to bury their commander in the river, sent a flag of truce ashore, to discover that there for was a local Masonic Lodge. William W Leake, the acting Master of Bayou Sara Lodge was approached by Captain Sammuel White, who lived near the river, to hold a Masonic Funeral for Commander Hart.

Brother Leake replied **"As an Officer of the Confederate Army, I feel it's my duty. As a Mason I know it is my duty."** On June 13th, a few members of the local lodge in Masonic regalia gathered and met the procession of 50 men from the Albatross under a flag of truce at the top of a hill, Brothers Benjamin F. and Samuel F. White of Bayou Sara Lodge, the surgeon and two officers of the gunboat who were Masons were in the procession along with a detail of Marines at "Trail Arms."

Leake and local Brothers marched in front of the corpse to Grace Episcopal Church Cemetery and buried Brother Hart in the Masonic section, with Military Honors and the service of the Eppisopal Church read over him. Brother Leake led the Masonic part of the services. The U.S. Surgeon and officers asked the Brothers to join them aboard the Albatross for dinner, but they declined. The surgeon then offered Brother Leake to supply him with medicines for his family. Brother Leake declined but later the surgeon sent a few medications to Leake through Brother Sammuel White.

Hart's grave was marked with a wooden head plate for many years and eventually a permanent marker covering the whole grave was dedicated. This marker states: *"This monument is dedicated in loving tribute to the University of Freemasonry."*

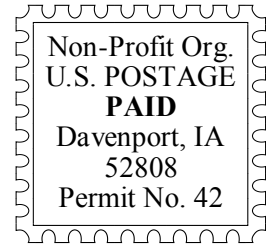
